One solution meets many language needs

Challenges

The Clarksville-Montgomery County School System (CMCSS) mission is to educate and empower students to reach their full potential. With 32,500 students in 39 schools, and 44 languages spoken in the Tennessee district, a comprehensive solution was needed to support the district's multiple language requirements. CMCSS also serves military families stationed at nearby Fort Campbell, with many students bringing world language experience gained while overseas. This created a demand for added resources to assess students' language proficiency, complement traditional instruction, and enable students to continue their language studies even if a certified teacher was not available. A potential language solution also needed to serve English Language Learners and their families, add instructional flexibility for Adult ESOL classes, and align with grade and credit recovery guidelines.

Implementation

CMCSS implemented the Rosetta Stone® Foundations for K-12 solution for ELL and World Language instruction, and as an ESOL resource for adult learners. This digital approach:

- Provided engaging, interactive language lessons
- Reinforced classroom instruction with supplemental materials
- Allowed students and adults to learn at their own pace
- Ensured only the target language was heard and used
- Offered pronunciation feedback to build speaking confidence

Serving military families

CMCSS enrolls many students from families stationed at Fort Campbell, the nation's second largest military base. Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) grants and the Military Interstate Children's Compact Mission help support the district's own commitment to enhance learning opportunities for students of military families that move frequently, including from international locations. It was not possible to hire teachers for every world language that students learned or studied before coming to CMCSS. "Working in an online environment is second nature to students," said Dr. Kimi Sucharski, District Accountability and Data Analyst. The Rosetta Stone® digital solution provided the newly arriving students interactive language instruction and gave teachers an assessment tool to help determine a student's language proficiency. Students were then able to receive credit as appropriate and continue learning online when a certified teacher in that language was not on staff.

Blended-learning success

Combining an EdTech language solution with traditional instruction creating blended-learning opportunities. ESL and regular teachers often taught in tandem. At other times, some students worked with an ESL teacher rotating through groups while the Rosetta Stone program enabled others to continue learning at their own pace. Beyond its digital language solution, Rosetta Stone also provided supplemental materials to align with classroom instruction, including teachers guides, tests and workbooks with teacher answer keys, flash cards, reading exercises, memory cards, games, and more. Immediate feedback while using supplemental materials increased student motivation to learn. According to Dr. Sucharski, teachers found that these materials "... increased student opportunities to apply language, facilitated deeper and broader learning, and increased student engagement."

Supporting adult learners

CMCSS values parental engagement. Families desiring to learn English received access to the interactive program, both at home and at district learning centers. Adult ESOL and GED programs added online language learning as an additional resource for English language instruction. According to Dr. Sucharski, adults developed English skills more rapidly when using the interactive program. This benefited GED students needing to make quick progress in non-language subjects. Digital instruction also enabled adults to learn and practice English outside the classroom at their own pace.

Grade and credit recovery

Adding online language learning served many district needs, including grade and credit recovery. CMCSS found that the program aligned with language classes based on the district's recovery guidelines. Spanish, French, Latin, and English were the languages most often studied online. The program also enabled CMCSS to add several new languages for students, including Arabic, Korean, and Chinese (Mandarin). Language credits using the Rosetta Stone program could be earned starting in 8th grade.
