Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

ESEA Title I – Provides local districts money to improve academic achievement in high-poverty schools. It is the largest federal K-12 program.

- Part A 𝔍 − Districts distribute the funds to high-poverty schools to serve students who are failing or most at risk of failing to meet challenging state academic standards.
- Part C D − Supports high quality education programs for migratory children and helps ensure that these students are not penalized in any manner by disparities among states in curriculum, graduation requirements, or state academic content and student academic achievement standards.
- Part D 𝔊 Supports programs serving at-risk youth including youth who have come in contact with the juvenile justice system; young people who are at least one year behind their expected grade level; migrant and immigrant youth; LEP students; and gang members.

ESEA Title III, Part A → Provides funds to improve the education of Limited English Proficient (LEP) students by helping them learn English and meet the same academic standards as their English-speaking peers.

ESEA Title VI, Part B - Rural Education Initiative allows rural school districts to spend funds on programs covered by Title I, Part A and Title III, Part A.

School Improvement Grants (SIG)

SIG 🔊 – Grants awarded to State Education Authorities (SEAs) who then provide competitive subgrants to districts that demonstrate the greatest need for the funds and the strongest commitment to use the funds to raise the achievement of students in their lowest-performing schools.

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

Part B 🔊 – An LEA may use IDEA, Part B funds for the costs of special education and related services, and supplementary aids and services provided in a regular class or other education-related setting to a child with a disability in accordance with their individualized education program (IEP).

McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, Title VI

Part C 🔊 – Provides funds to help homeless children receive equal access to the same quality of public education as other children.

Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Education Act

Carl D. Perkins (2) – Provides funds to help prepare a workforce with the academic and vocational skills needed to compete successfully in the world market.
