Making English language learning a family affair

A district with a diverse student makeup

Located in the New Orleans metro area, the Jefferson Parish Public School System (JPPSS) is Louisiana's largest educational district with 48 elementary schools, 13 middle schools, 10 high schools and 14 mixed-grade schools. The 85 schools serve nearly 50,000 pre-K-12 students, who are roughly 40 percent African American, 27 percent Hispanic, 27 percent white, and 5 percent Asian. JPPSS seeks to foster the parish's best-educated generation by putting students at the heart of its work and taking steps to meet the needs of its diverse student population, which includes nearly 7,500 students with limited English proficiency.

A growing number of ESL students

In the last decade, JPPSS has seen a rising Hispanic enrollment rate and has welcomed a growing number of students with limited English proficiency, many whom migrated from Central America. Just eight years ago, 16 percent of JPPSS students were Hispanic and roughly 8 percent had limited English proficiency. For the 2017-18 school year, the district's overall Hispanic student population increased to nearly 30 percent, with roughly 15 percent of students classified as having limited English proficiency. In 12 individual JPPSS schools, Hispanic students comprised more than 50 percent of total enrollment. More than three in 10 learners had limited English proficiency in 15 district schools.

JPPSS leaders believe that all children deserve a highquality education that develops their unique talents by building upon their individual strengths, and that academic success should not be determined by race or socioeconomic background. Therefore, the district was determined to meet the needs of its growing English as a Second Language (ESL) population. To help these students build their English proficiency and thrive in school, JPPSS knew additional language learning supports had to be implemented in a timely and wellplanned manner.



Providing ESLs high-quality instruction

In order to ensure high-quality English language instruction for its ESL students, JPPSS developed a specialized program with the goal of helping students attain English proficiency, develop high levels of achievement in core academic subjects, and meet challenging state academic standards.

As part of this strategy, during the 2014-15 school year JPPSS partnered with Rosetta Stone to implement digital language learning and Lexia Reading® for its ESL students. Today, 700 ESL students in grades 3-12 at schools across the district use Rosetta Stone® English. Students are recommended to the program by their teachers after their English language skills are assessed. Those who need additional support are placed in the ESL program where they meet in small groups with ESL-certified teachers and bilingual para-professionals and use the program on a school computer or iPad. Students who have an internet-connected device at home, such as a smartphone or tablet, can also access the program remotely.

While older students enjoy the speech recognition feature that evaluates their pronunciation and provides feedback, younger ESL students in grades K-1 benefit from using Lexia Reading to help them learn to read and speak English. In just the first three months of the 2018-19 school year, the district's ESL students in grades 3-12 have spent more than 1,500 hours using the digital language program.

Instruction informed by data

Teachers and students at JPPSS benefit from the comprehensive data provided by Rosetta Stone.
